Assistant Professor English/SAS Honors Program, Rutgers University
My duties are evenly divided between the English Department, where I teach classes in Creative Writing and Creative Non-Fiction, and the SAS Honors program. For the latter, I teach regular Interdisciplinary Honors Seminars as well as providing support to students writing their interdisciplinary theses. I also lead a one-credit 'Great Short Reads' class that is focused on novellas. Over the past three years, I have led a group of students on a spring break experience in Ireland. I also lead a successful summer creative writing program (about to celebrate its 10th anniversary) based in England.

Sept. 2007 to June 2016 Writer in Residence, SAS Honors Program, Rutgers University
I advised and assisted students as they worked to develop, research, and draft their Capstone Projects. I taught sections of the SAS Honors Colloquium, including a hybrid section offered during the summer. I also designed and taught three fully-subscribed interdisciplinary Honors Seminars. The first of these focused on the relationship of humans to the natural world. The second traced the evolution of the jury trial. My latest seminar, which uses poetry, folk songs, speeches, fiction and plays to look at the formation of an Irish national identity, is combined with a week-long Study Abroad trip to Ireland. All three Seminars were designed to challenge students to respond to complex material in a variety of forms, both academic and creative.

Sept. 2008 to June 2016

Teacher of Creative Writing and Creative Non Fiction, Rutgers University I taught two three-credit classes in the English Department. One was a 200-level introduction to creative writing that included fiction, poetry, non-fiction and drama. The other, a 300-level creative non-fiction course, covered writing about people, place and performance. I also designed and led an annual Study Abroad summer program based in Lewes, England. Now in its tenth year, the program combines writing with walking and visits to sites of literary interest.

Aug. 2007 & 2008

Language & Thinking Program, Bard College, Annandale-on-Hudson I taught a three-week course in critical reading, essay writing, and revision to a group of incoming freshmen. The course was based on an anthology that included essays, poetry, fiction, and drama. It built toward the writing of a critical essay that engaged with core anthology texts.
